WELCOME TO OUR MONTHLY ROUND-UP

MAY EDITION

In May, we continued to work in Syria, our malnutrition teams reaching out to displacement camps in Northwest Syria, as construction continues in Al Zohoor town. In Palestine, Human Appeal held a workshop to help farmers, provided olive trees to help build livelihoods, and distributed food parcels and medical supplies in the wake of the escalation. In Yemen, Human Appeal continued to build Al Samad school and provided medical supplies to the neonatal ICU at Althawra Hospital. In Pakistan, construction has continued on the Shelter Project, to provide homes to people affected by the 2022 floods. In Somalia, we coordinated with the district administration and launched both a water supply project and a food parcel distribution project.

LIVELIHOODS

Work continues in Al Zohoor town, the area where Human Appeal built a thousand homes for displaced Syrian families. Construction on repairing and building roads and pathways in the town and lighting them with solar-powered lights continues.

CHILDREN

We revisited baby Zohoor, the baby born in Al-Zohoor village shortly after the Syria-Turkey earthquakes struck, to find her happy and healthy.

Hanan is doing her best to provide for her two baby girls in Syria.

Hanan lives in the Al Bayan displacement camp with her husband and two baby girls. Her husband can't work due to a disease in his spinal discs, making it difficult for the family to afford to eat well.

When the Human Appeal nutrition team met Hanan, they discovered that her two daughters, Fatima and Islam, were suffering from malnutrition. A nutrition specialist from Human Appeal followed up on the girls, visiting them every 15 days to check on their health, and providing a referral to a specialist doctor at the Maryam Health Centre to improve their nutrition. Fatima and Islam were provided with milk and nutritional supplements for about four months until the two girls fully recovered.

"I felt sad and disturbed when I knew of the bad condition of my daughters and that they were suffering from malnutrition. Without the presence of this team, I would not have known about that," Hanan told us, and thanked the team for their good work.



FOOD SECURITY

A workshop was held for 30 farmers at Wadi Salqa, sharing insights, challenges and knowledge surrounding their ownership of crops, helping them to be aware of their rights, and empowering them to continue to protect and grow their crops.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE

During the recent escalation in May, Human Appeal distributed 546 food parcels to families in Gaza, containing enough essentials to last them three weeks.

LIVELIHOODS

Human Appeal Ireland helped to provide 47 farmers in rural areas of the Gaza Strip with 30 healthy and fruit-bearing olive tree seedlings, along with building an irrigation network for their land.

HEALTH


We distributed over £40,000 worth of medicine and medical disposables to hospitals across Gaza to help them keep their services running following the violence in May, which badly stretched already limited medical supplies.

WATER AND SANITATION


Our team helped distribute over 18,000 litres of chlorine solution and disinfection materials to all water sources, including 29 water wells.






WATER AND SANITATION

Human Appeal launched a water supply project for displaced people in the Bardere district, which will provide families in vulnerable situations with 45 litres of clean water each day for a month.


Food distribution in progress in Somalia.



FOOD SECURITY

We coordinated with the District Administration of the Bardere region to assess the extent of the drought and identify needs in the districted areas. We assessed 18 displacement camps across the city, and registered 500 people in vulnerable situations to distribute food parcels to.
