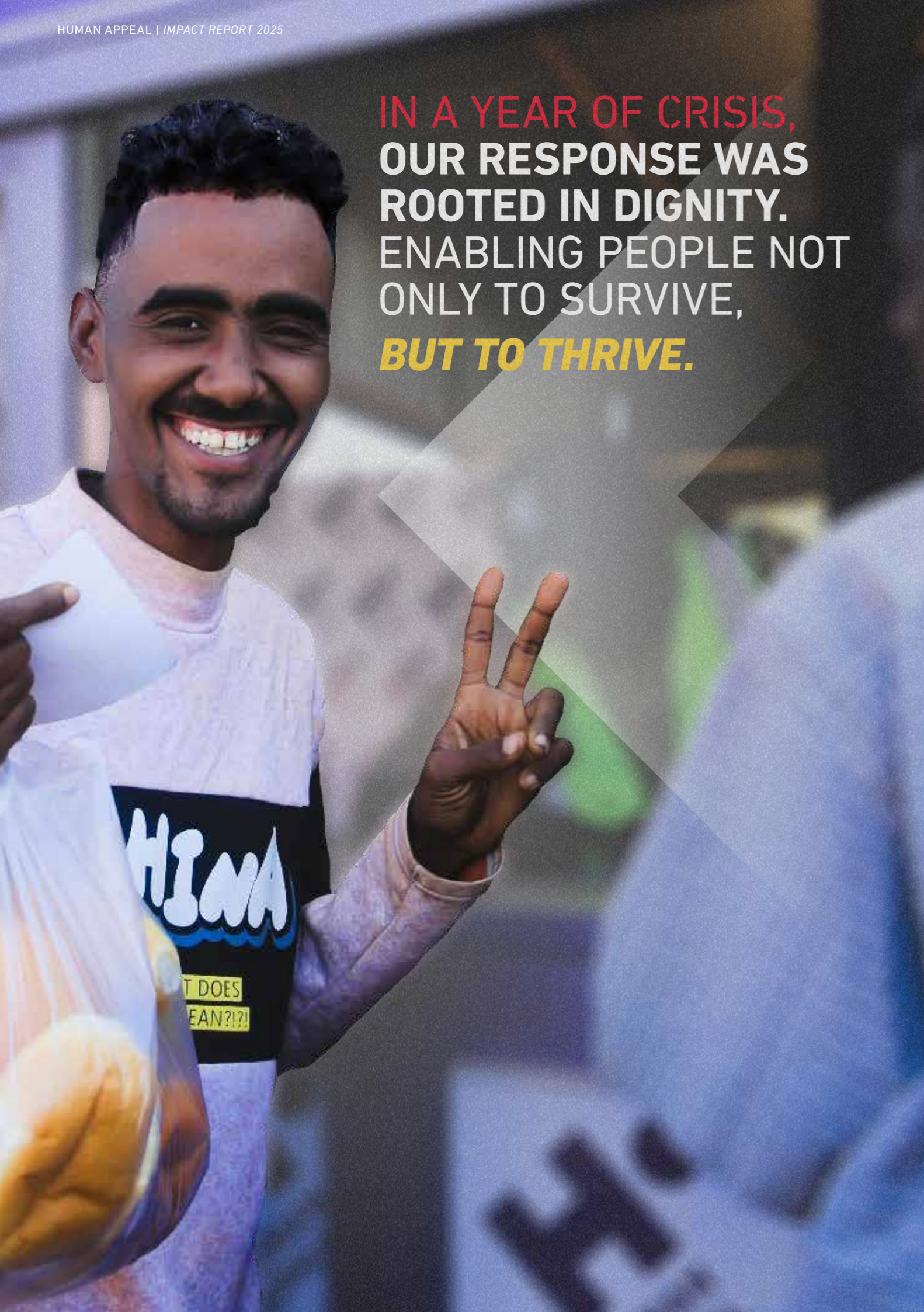

CEO WORD

**In the Name of Allah,

This year, as crises deepened and needs grew across the world, our response remained anchored in one powerful principle: **اعزاز - I'zaaz**, restoring dignity and honour for every human being.

Allah reminds us in the Qur'an:

"And We have certainly honoured the children of Adam..."
(Surah Al-Israa 17:70)

This divine honour is not dependent on wealth, status, nationality, or circumstances, it is inherent. Our role, as an organisation inspired by faith and guided by compassion, is to ensure that hardship does not strip people of the dignity Allah has already granted them.

Relief is essential in moments of crisis. But dignity goes further. It means enabling people to stand again, provide for their families, and shape their own futures with confidence and hope.

What اعزاز Means in Action

اعزاز means restoring honour - *seeing people not as passive recipients of aid, but as capable individuals with skills, dreams, and potential.*

اعزاز means enabling self-reliance - *moving from short-term relief to long-term opportunity, from dependency to independence.*

اعزاز means moving from aid to agency - *giving families the tools, resources, and confidence to rebuild their own lives with pride.*

This philosophy shaped our work across multiple countries this year.

From Survival to Self-Reliance

In *Syria*, families affected by years of conflict are receiving assistance and rebuilding livelihoods. Through planting initiatives, poultry farming, and livestock support, parents are once again able to generate income, feed their children, and plan for the future with renewed hope.

In *Pakistan*, dignity is being restored through opportunity. Small business projects are helping families create sustainable incomes, while solar-powered water wells are transforming entire communities, reducing hardship, improving health, and freeing people, especially women and children, from the daily burden of searching for water.

In *Senegal*, our support to fishing communities is a powerful example of **اعزاز** in action. Rather than temporary handouts, fishermen received boats and equipment, enabling them to earn independently, support their families, and strengthen their communities for years to come.

Across all these missions, the goal is the same: to ease today's suffering and protect tomorrow's dignity.

A Shared Moral Responsibility

This work would not be possible without the compassion and trust of our donors and partners.

Your support is more than charity. It is a commitment to upholding the honour that Allah has bestowed upon every human being. It is an investment in resilience, self-worth, and lasting change.

Since the escalation of the conflict in October 2023, Human Appeal's emergency response has delivered over **9.7 million hot meals and more than 142 million litres of clean water**, helping families endure one of the most severe humanitarian crises in recent history.



WHEN CRISIS STRUCK

Gaza | Ongoing Humanitarian Response

Across Gaza, families have spent another year facing displacement, damaged infrastructure, and severe shortages of food, clean water, and healthcare. Throughout 2025, Human Appeal maintained a sustained emergency response to support families navigating these conditions.

Across the year, **5,831,524 hot meals were distributed**, helping families meet their most immediate food needs. **31,388 food parcels** also reached vulnerable households, each containing staple items such as flour, rice, lentils, cooking oil, and canned goods, allowing families to prepare meals and sustain themselves for several weeks.

Clean water remained one of the most urgent needs. Through emergency water trucking and distribution points, **89,204,000 litres of clean water** were delivered to communities cut off from damaged municipal systems.

Healthcare access has also been severely limited. Human Appeal's **mobile medical clinics treated 85,564 patients in 2025**, providing consultations and essential medicines to displaced families.

2025 Emergency Response Overview

Responding with speed. Serving with dignity.

In 2025, Human Appeal delivered **138 emergency projects** across **15 countries**, reaching **2,761,965 people** affected by conflict, disaster, and displacement. From rapid food distributions to medical aid and shelter, every response was rooted in protecting human dignity during moments of greatest vulnerability.

The timeline below highlights key emergency interventions delivered throughout the year. It reflects major response moments rather than an exhaustive list.

NADA'S STORY

Nada is a Palestinian woman displaced by the ongoing war in Gaza. Her husband was killed in the fighting, and her son remains buried beneath the rubble of their home in Beit Lahia. After repeated attacks, she and her relatives fled seeking safety.

“I am Nada. We just came from the recent displacement from Beit Lahia.”

When their neighbourhood was evacuated, the family left with nothing.

“We were forced to evacuate, and we took nothing with us. No money, no food, no water. We had absolutely nothing.”

Now they live in overcrowded conditions with extended family.

“We ended up in a room with about 20 people: me, my sister, her husband, and children. Half of us stay in this part and the other half stay in that part because there is not enough space.”



JANUARY – MARCH

Myanmar | Earthquake Emergency

On 28 March 2025, a 7.7 magnitude earthquake struck central Myanmar, killing thousands and displacing families across six regions. Human Appeal supported **1,000 households** with emergency food parcels and provided sleeping items to **1,000 families** sheltering outdoors, alongside **4,000** food and water packs to stabilise urgent needs.



MAY

Azad Jammu & Kashmir | Conflict Emergency

Cross-border clashes damaged more than **250 homes** across Bagh, Haveli, and Poonch districts, forcing families to flee. Human Appeal distributed **350 food parcels** to affected households and provided **350 winter-grade blankets** to help families stay safe during harsh conditions.

JUNE - JULY

Niger State, Nigeria | Flood Emergency

Heavy rainfall and a dam collapse triggered severe flooding in Mokwa, causing loss of life and widespread displacement. Human Appeal reached **256 families** with **1,024 food parcels**, distributed **3,484 clothing items** and **1,024 mattresses and blankets**, and deployed a temporary medical clinic to treat water-borne and respiratory illnesses and provide psychosocial support.

West Bank | Escalation & Displacement

Violent incursions in Tulkarem and Jenin refugee camps led to significant destruction, displacement, and shortages of food, water, and medical supplies. Human Appeal distributed **558 food parcels**, provided **hygiene kits** and **essential household items**, supplied **blankets** and **mattresses** to displaced families, and deployed a **mobile medical unit** to deliver first aid and ongoing treatment.

Pakistan | Heatwave Emergency

Temperatures exceeding 50°C placed vulnerable communities at severe risk of dehydration and heatstroke. Over 30 consecutive days, four roadside relief camps reached **176,197 people** with chilled drinks and **36,126 litres** of water, while shaded rest areas provided protection from extreme heat.

Syria | Wildfire Emergency

Extensive wildfires burned between 10,000 and 15,000 hectares in rural Latakia, forcing evacuations and destroying homes and farmland. Human Appeal distributed **150 food baskets**, provided **150 non-food kits** including bedding, and delivered **150 hygiene kits** to families who had lost their belongings.

Nigeria | Post-Flood Recovery

Following the devastating floods in Niger State, recovery efforts focused on restoring safe water access and basic infrastructure. Human Appeal drilled **three wells**, installed pumping machines and water systems, constructed fetching points, and installed **12 solar streetlights** to support affected communities.



AUGUST

Pakistan | Flash Flood Emergency

A sudden cloudburst caused flash floods and landslides across multiple districts, displacing families and disrupting essential services. Human Appeal distributed over **18,600 hot meals** across relief camps, provided **900 hygiene kits** in collaboration with UNICEF, and treated **2,316 patients** through emergency medical camps.

Afghanistan | Earthquake

A magnitude 6 earthquake caused extensive destruction across eastern provinces, leaving thousands without shelter or sanitation. Human Appeal distributed over **9,000 hot meals** and **765 food parcels**, provided **514 kitchen sets**, and installed **50 showers** and **100 latrines** to restore basic hygiene and dignity.

In every emergency, our commitment remained the same: rapid response, compassionate delivery, and dignity for every family served.



NOVEMBER

Dhaka | Urban Fire Emergency

A major fire in Korail, one of Dhaka's largest informal settlements, displaced 3,300 residents and destroyed homes and belongings. Human Appeal supported **550 families** with winter clothing, hygiene items, and distributed **1,100 blankets** and **bedding sets** to restore warmth and stability.

Sri Lanka | Cyclone & Flood Emergency

Cyclone Ditwa brought severe rainfall and flooding, causing widespread devastation across affected communities. Human Appeal distributed **470 non-food item** kits including kitchenware and bedding and supported **470 families** with dry food parcels to assist early recovery.

REGIONAL CONTEXT

Across the Middle East, communities continue to endure the long shadow of conflict, displacement, and economic instability. Families face rising food prices, fragile healthcare systems, and growing water scarcity, while repeated shocks erode already limited safety nets. Yet within this uncertainty, communities continue to show resilience, seeking not only survival but stability and dignity for their children.



OUR WORK ACROSS THE MIDDLE EAST

In 2025, Human Appeal delivered over **262 projects** across the Middle East, supporting communities through food security, healthcare, education, water and sanitation, protection, and shelter programmes. Alongside emergency assistance, many programmes focused on restoring stability for families rebuilding their lives after years of crisis and displacement.



GAZA

“I HAVE NOT EATEN SINCE YESTERDAY, BUT I STILL BRING FOOD FOR MY CHILDREN. I PUT THEM BEFORE MYSELF.”



Nahla lives in Gaza, where ongoing conflict and repeated displacement have stripped families of safety and stability. Like many parents, she struggles each day to meet the most basic needs of her children.

“This is war and hunger, and God did not command this.”

With little access to food, clean water, or secure shelter, daily life has become a constant struggle. Their tent offers little protection from the heat and harsh conditions.

Despite everything, Nahla continues to endure, determined to care for her children through unimaginable hardship.

FOOD SECURITY AND LIVELIHOODS

For families affected by conflict and displacement, securing daily food can become a constant challenge. Human Appeal supported communities across the region through food assistance programmes and livelihood initiatives designed to restore stability and independence.

In **Syria**, poultry farming support reached **396 returnees in 2025**, helping families establish small-scale chicken farming that provides both food and income. In **Yemen**, Human Appeal's bakery project produces more than **19,000 loaves of bread every day**, ensuring vulnerable families have access to fresh bread as a reliable source of nutrition.



HEALTH AND NUTRITION

Years of conflict and displacement have placed enormous pressure on healthcare systems across the region, leaving many families without reliable access to medical treatment. Human Appeal supports healthcare through hospitals, mobile clinics and critical medical supplies reaching communities where services have been disrupted.

Mobile medical clinics continue to deliver essential care to displaced families across **Gaza**, while in **Syria**, medical supply distributions supported **20,400 people across seven governorates**, helping hospitals and healthcare centres continue operating despite severe shortages. In **Yemen**, cataract surgery support enabled **110 people to regain their sight in 2025**, restoring independence and dignity.



SYRIA Al Imaan Hospital

Human Appeal operates **Al Imaan Hospital in northwest Syria**, providing lifesaving healthcare to communities affected by years of conflict and displacement.

Following the addition of two new hospital floors to meet growing demand, the facility now treats over **6,000 patients every month**, providing emergency obstetric care, paediatric services, trauma treatment, and essential primary healthcare.

In 2024 alone, more than **5,000 babies were safely delivered** at the hospital. By mid-2025, the facility had already supported **32,955 patients**, serving as a critical healthcare lifeline for families living in nearby camps and communities with few alternatives for medical care.



FATIMA'S STORY

“WE LEFT OUR HOMES, CAME HERE AND NOW LIVE IN THIS CAMP.”

Fatima now lives with her family in Al-Barr camp in Kafr Karmeen after being displaced from their home in Abzimo.

During her pregnancy, Fatima sought care at Human Appeal's Al Imaan Hospital, where she gave birth to triplet sons.

“When I entered Al Imaan Hospital, I received so much care and attention from the nurses. They took great care of me.”

One of the babies, Ahmed, required specialist care after birth and remained in an incubator for 21 days. Today, her children are healthy.

“Now he is fine and in good health, like his brothers, Alhamdulillah.”



WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE

Reliable access to safe water remains a challenge in many parts of the region where infrastructure has been damaged or destroyed by conflict. Human Appeal supported communities through water trucking, school water systems and hygiene interventions that reduce disease risk and support safe daily living.

In **Gaza**, water trucking reached **400,000 people** in 2025, delivering clean water to families cut off from municipal systems. In Yemen, school water systems benefited **55,647 students**, ensuring clean drinking water on site and supporting attendance and learning.



EDUCATION AND CHILDREN

Conflict and displacement continue to disrupt children's education across the region, leaving families searching for stability and safe learning environments. Human Appeal supported education through temporary learning spaces, school rehabilitation and Back to School programmes.

In **Gaza**, temporary learning spaces supported **3,800 students** through **50 learning sites**, with an initial phase supporting **800 students**. In Syria, Sabr School rehabilitation restored safe learning access for **4,616 students** through repairs and heating support.



CASH AND DIGNITY BASED SUPPORT

In fragile contexts, families often need the flexibility to decide what their household needs most. Human Appeal supported households through cash and voucher assistance programmes that allow families to purchase essential items such as food, medicine and household supplies.

In **Syria**, cash vouchers supported **6,955 returnees in 2025**, enabling families to purchase food and essential goods according to their own priorities. In Lebanon, **4,575 people** received Zakat funded financial assistance during Ramadan, helping vulnerable households meet basic living costs.



SHELTER



Harsh winters place vulnerable families at serious risk when homes lack insulation, heating, or adequate clothing. Human Appeal provides winter support to help households stay safe during the coldest months.

In **Afghanistan**, winter assistance reached **5,849 people**, providing blankets, warm clothing, and heating fuel to families facing freezing temperatures.

Across the region, similar support helped vulnerable households endure winter. In Syria, **10,502 people** received winter kits, while **5,838 people** in Yemen and **1,290 people** in Iraq were supported with blankets, mattresses, and warm clothing.

REGIONAL CONTEXT

Across Asia, communities face a combination of climate shocks, economic instability, displacement, and entrenched poverty. Floods, drought, and rising living costs continue to place pressure on vulnerable households, particularly in rural and hard to reach areas. For many families, humanitarian support remains essential not only for survival, but for restoring stability and opportunity.



OUR WORK ACROSS ASIA

In 2025, Human Appeal delivered **100 projects** across **Asia** spanning food security and livelihoods, healthcare, education, water and sanitation, protection, and emergency assistance. These programmes supported vulnerable communities across **Pakistan, Bangladesh, India, Afghanistan, Myanmar, Nepal, and Sri Lanka**, addressing both immediate needs and longer term resilience.



BANGLADESH

“IF WE HAD CLEAN WATER, ALL OUR PROBLEMS WOULD BE SOLVED.”



Abdul Rahman is a 66-year-old farmer from Sadipur village in Bangladesh, where unsafe drinking water has affected the health of many families.

“About 20 years ago, I started noticing it. Back then my body wasn’t weak like it is now; I was strong.”

Over time, the water began to cause serious health problems, leaving him unable to work.

“Drinking this water causes a lot of gas. It’s unbearable, and my body burns. I can’t work, and that’s the main problem.”

Doctors later confirmed the illness was caused by the contaminated water, a problem affecting the entire community.

FOOD SECURITY AND LIVELIHOODS

When income disappears, families are forced to choose between feeding their children today and protecting their future tomorrow. Human Appeal’s livelihood programmes help households rebuild stability by creating reliable sources of income.

In **Pakistan**, the Honeybee Livelihood Project supported **300 people** in 2025, helping families establish small scale beekeeping enterprises that generate income while improving pollination of local crops. For families with limited land or resources, beekeeping offers a practical pathway toward long-term food security and financial independence.



HEALTH AND NUTRITION

Access to basic healthcare can remain out of reach for families living in remote or underserved communities. Human Appeal supports communities across Asia with medical services that help prevent avoidable suffering and restore independence.

Mobile health clinics in **Sindh** and **Tharparkar** in **Pakistan** delivered primary healthcare, vaccinations, and maternal health services to remote villages without permanent health facilities. Alongside this work, **133 cataract surgeries** restored sight for patients who had lived with preventable blindness, including **80** elderly people who regained independence after treatment.

WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WASH)

Clean water is fundamental to health, yet many communities continue to rely on contaminated or unreliable sources. Human Appeal supports sustainable water systems that reduce disease and ease the daily burden of water collection.

In **Pakistan**, solar-powered reverse osmosis filtration plants provided safe drinking water for **39,241 people**, helping communities affected by flooding access clean water while reducing waterborne illness.

EDUCATION

Children's education is often disrupted when families face poverty, disaster, or displacement. Human Appeal supports safe learning environments so students can continue their studies despite these challenges.

In **Dhirkot**, Azad Jammu and Kashmir, the construction of an earthquake resilient girls' college created a safe learning environment for **1,058 students**, including **1,000 girls**. A further **140 students** benefited from the reconstruction of a government girls' middle school in the region.

SHELTER

Harsh winters place vulnerable families at serious risk when homes lack insulation, heating, or adequate clothing. Human Appeal provides winter support to help households stay safe during the coldest months.

In **Afghanistan**, winterisation assistance reached **5,849 people**, providing blankets, warm clothing, and heating fuel to help families endure harsh winter conditions.

PROTECTION

Children living in poverty or surviving on the streets face heightened risks of exploitation and lost educational opportunities. Human Appeal's protection programmes provide safe spaces, education, and support to help vulnerable children build safer futures.

In **Bangladesh**, the Odhikar Street Children Outreach Project supported **300 street children** in Dhaka with education, healthcare, and psychosocial support. In Pakistan, the Amina Protection and Learning Centre in Lahore supported **5,966 children** and youth, offering education, vocational training, healthcare, and family reintegration services.

REGIONAL CONTEXT

Across **Africa**, conflict, climate shocks, economic instability, and displacement continue to drive humanitarian need. Communities in countries such as **Sudan** and **Somalia** face acute food insecurity, fragile health systems, and limited access to essential services. For many families, humanitarian support remains critical to maintaining stability and protecting dignity amid prolonged hardship.



OUR WORK ACROSS AFRICA

In 2025, Human Appeal delivered **135 projects** across **Africa**, supporting vulnerable communities through food security programmes, healthcare interventions, water access initiatives, education support, and emergency relief. Across diverse contexts ranging from conflict in **Sudan** to climate shocks in **Somalia**, these programmes helped families meet urgent needs while strengthening resilience for the future.



SENEGAL

Mouhamed is 15 and lives in Senegal. Like many teenagers, he dreams of going to school and spending time with friends, but his mobility impairment made travelling independently extremely difficult.

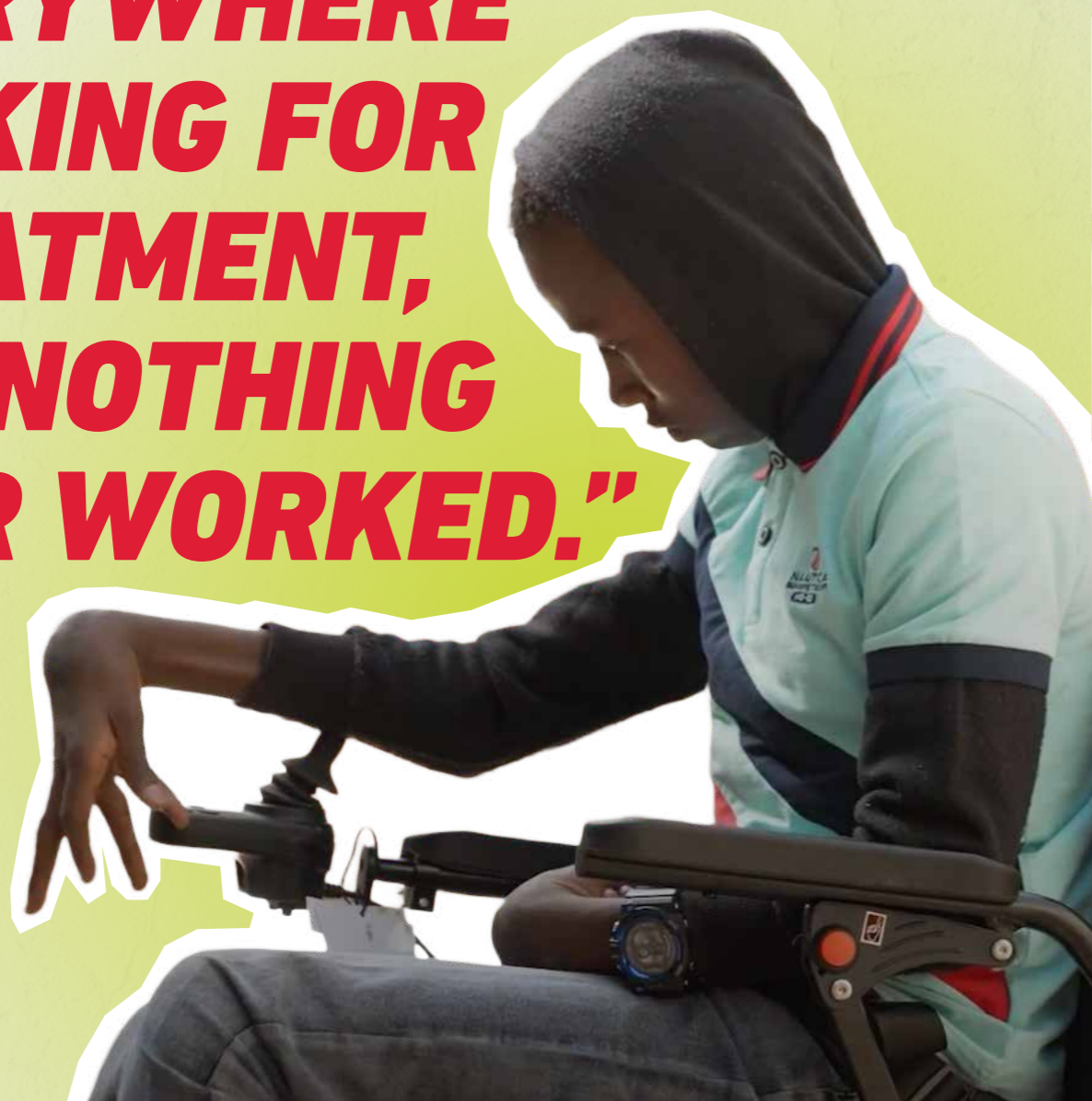
His father recalls the challenges their family faced while searching for help.

Through Human Appeal's support, Mouhamed received an **electric wheelchair**, helping restore his independence and allowing him to move more freely.

"Like every child, Mouhamed wants to go to school," his father says.

With improved mobility, Mouhamed can now access education and take part in daily life alongside other children in his community.

"WE WENT EVERYWHERE LOOKING FOR TREATMENT, BUT NOTHING EVER WORKED."



FOOD SECURITY AND LIVELIHOODS

Conflict, displacement, and economic disruption have left many families across **Africa** struggling to access reliable food supplies. Human Appeal's food security programmes support vulnerable households by helping communities maintain access to essential staples during times of crisis.

In Sudan, the **Human Appeal charity bakery in Omdurman** continued to provide a vital food lifeline for families displaced by conflict. Throughout 2025, the bakery produced **19,200 pieces of fresh bread each day**, reaching **17,000 people** who had lost homes, income, and access to regular food supplies.



HEALTH AND NUTRITION

Fragile healthcare systems across parts of Africa continue to face pressure from conflict, displacement, and economic hardship. Human Appeal supports medical programmes that help communities access treatment and prevent avoidable suffering.

In Somalia, **700 people** regained their sight through **cataract surgeries**, allowing individuals who had lived with preventable blindness to return to daily life and support their families.

Human Appeal also strengthened healthcare capacity in Mogadishu by delivering **1,097 containers of essential medical supplies** to **four hospitals**, helping frontline medical teams treat patients despite severe shortages of equipment and medicines.



WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE

Ongoing conflict in **Khartoum State** has destroyed water infrastructure, leaving many families without access to safe drinking water.

In response, Human Appeal's water trucking programme reached **8,500 people**, delivering clean water to communities cut off from functioning water systems.



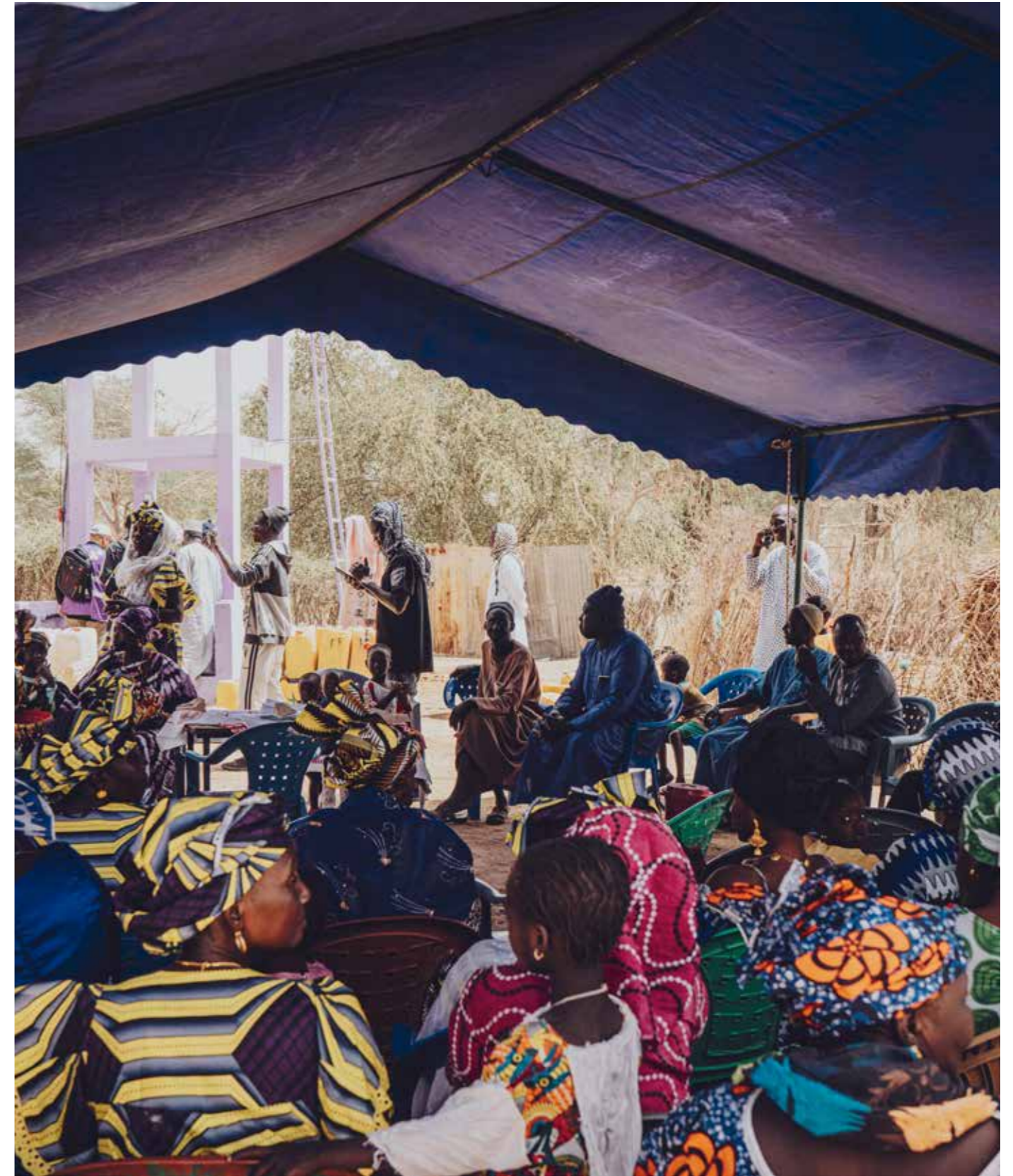
EDUCATION AND CHILDREN

Children living through conflict and displacement are at high risk of losing access to education. Human Appeal supports initiatives that help students remain in school, protecting their future opportunities even during times of crisis.

In **Sudan**, **200 children** received back-to-school support, helping families access essential learning materials despite economic hardship and displacement. In **Somalia**, a further **400 children** benefited from education support, helping prevent school dropout and enabling students to continue their studies in challenging circumstances.



SHELTER



Escalating conflict in **Sudan** has forced thousands of families to flee their homes with little protection from the elements.

In 2025, Human Appeal provided emergency shelters for **8,770 people**, giving displaced families a safe place to sleep while they work toward rebuilding their lives.

BUILDING RESILIENT COMMUNITIES

Across vulnerable communities, challenges such as water scarcity, poor health, food insecurity, and limited livelihoods are closely connected. Human Appeal's integrated village programmes respond to these realities by bringing together water, healthcare, education, and livelihood support, helping communities build lasting stability and resilience.

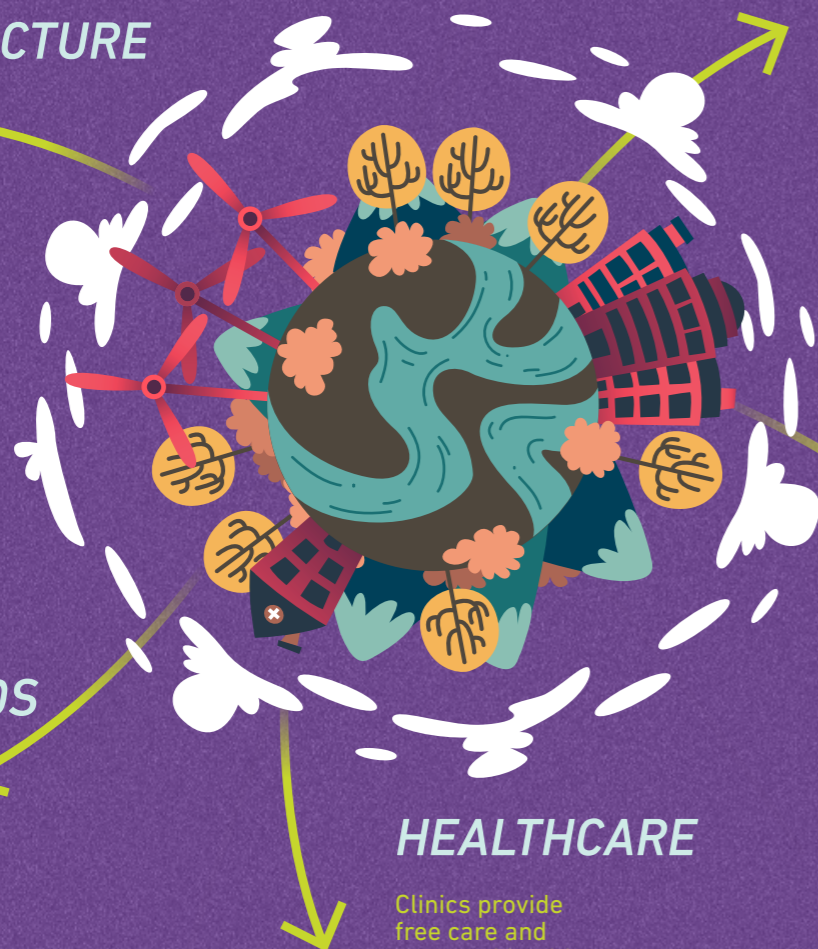

PAKISTAN

Tharparkar Integrated Development

In drought-prone **Tharparkar**, water scarcity, food insecurity, and limited livelihoods are deeply interconnected. Human Appeal's integrated village programme addresses these challenges together through water infrastructure, agricultural training, and livelihood support.

In 2025, the programme supported 4,680 people across participating villages.



Impact Highlights:

- **280,828 people** supported across **70** villages since 2011
- **70** solar water systems installed
- **1 million** litres of safe water provided daily

HEMA'S STORY

Hema is a mother of five living in **Tharparkar**, where collecting water once consumed hours of every day.

"It took hours to get water because the source is so far away. We filtered the water through cloth so we could drink it."

Even then, the water was unsafe and often caused illness.

Through Human Appeal's integrated village programme, clean water systems, household toilets, and solar-powered streetlights have

transformed life across the community.

"Now we have clean water, our life has gotten much better."

With water close to home, Hema now has more time to support her family.

"I make handicrafts like caps and quilts."

Electricity has also changed how she works.

"Now we have electricity, so I can make a quilt at night, which is a huge benefit."

SYRIA

Al Zohoor Integrated Recovery

In Al Zohoor village in **Idleb**, Human Appeal supports communities recovering from conflict and displacement through healthcare, education, and livelihood programmes.

The village's primary health centre now serves more than **6,780 people** each month, providing free treatment for communities with limited access to medical services. In 2025, **28,775 people** received essential **healthcare** and **medicine**.

Each year, more than **1,380 children** attend Al-Sabr School, while vocational training programmes help young people develop skills to rebuild their livelihoods.

MAHMOUD'S STORY

Mahmoud is 14 and lives in Al Zohoor village in **northwest Syria**. Years of conflict, displacement, and disaster repeatedly interrupted his education.

"My father died in an air strike eight years ago."

His family moved several times, and when the earthquake struck, their building collapsed.

"For three years, I couldn't attend school."

When Mahmoud's family arrived in Al Zohoor, Human Appeal's integrated village programme helped restore access to education.

Although he had fallen behind, Mahmoud began learning again.

"Now I can read and write, and I am good at maths. I want to become an engineer."

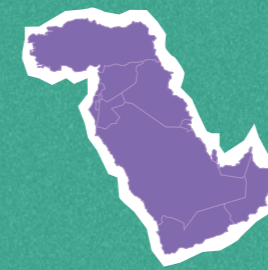

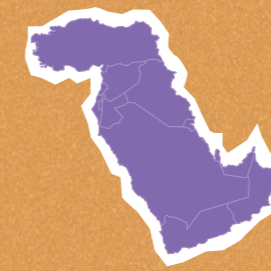

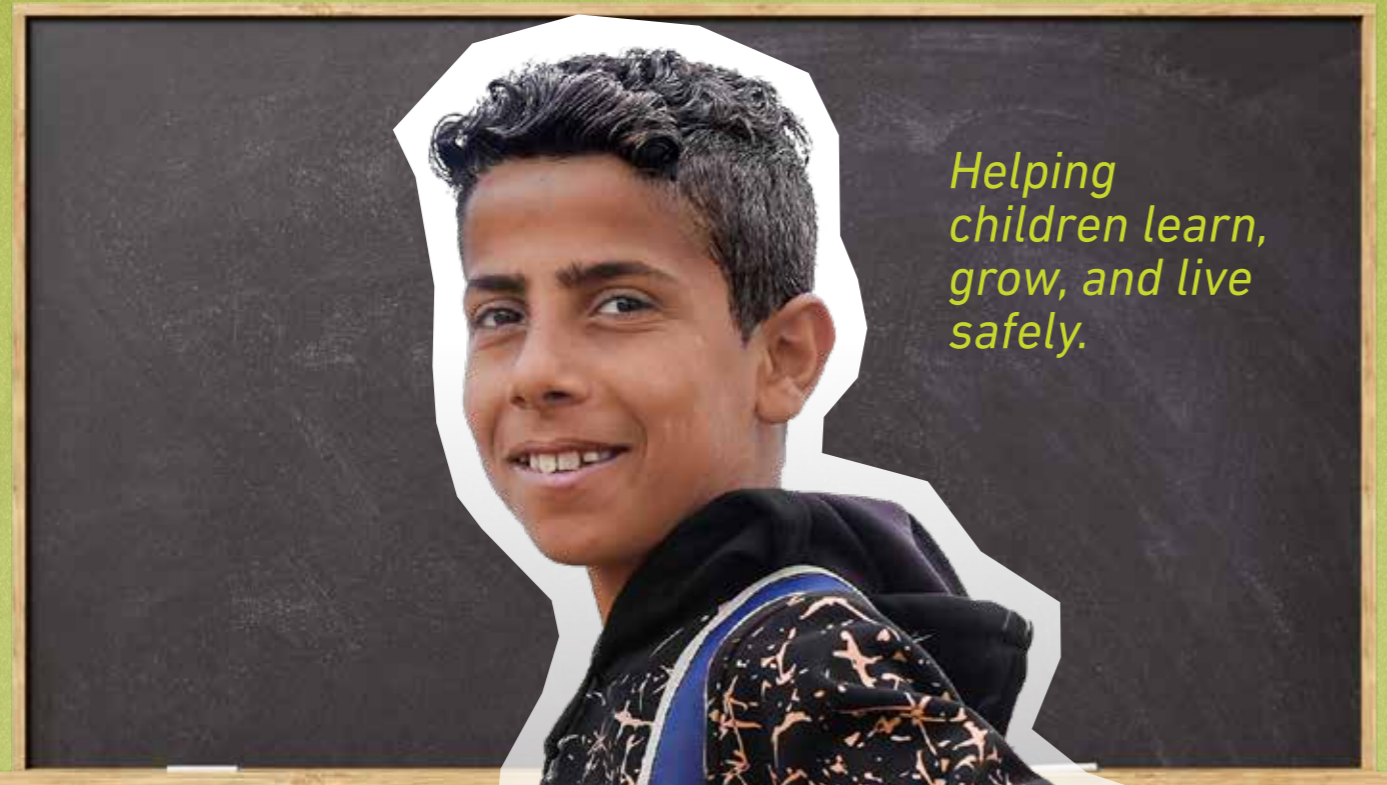

This act of worship reflects sacrifice, generosity, and care for those in need. Through your Qurbani donations, Human Appeal helped families facing conflict, displacement, drought, and rising food prices share in the joy of Eid al-Adha.

How Qurbani Support Helps Families

Qurbani distributions ensure vulnerable families can share in the blessings of Eid al-Adha and enjoy nutritious meals that may otherwise be out of reach.

Support includes:

- Sharia-compliant sacrifice of healthy animals
- Local sourcing to support farmers and markets
- Fresh meat distributed to vulnerable households
- Prioritising widows, orphans, displaced families, and those living in poverty

On average, families received around 3 kg of fresh meat, allowing them to prepare meaningful meals and celebrate Eid with dignity.

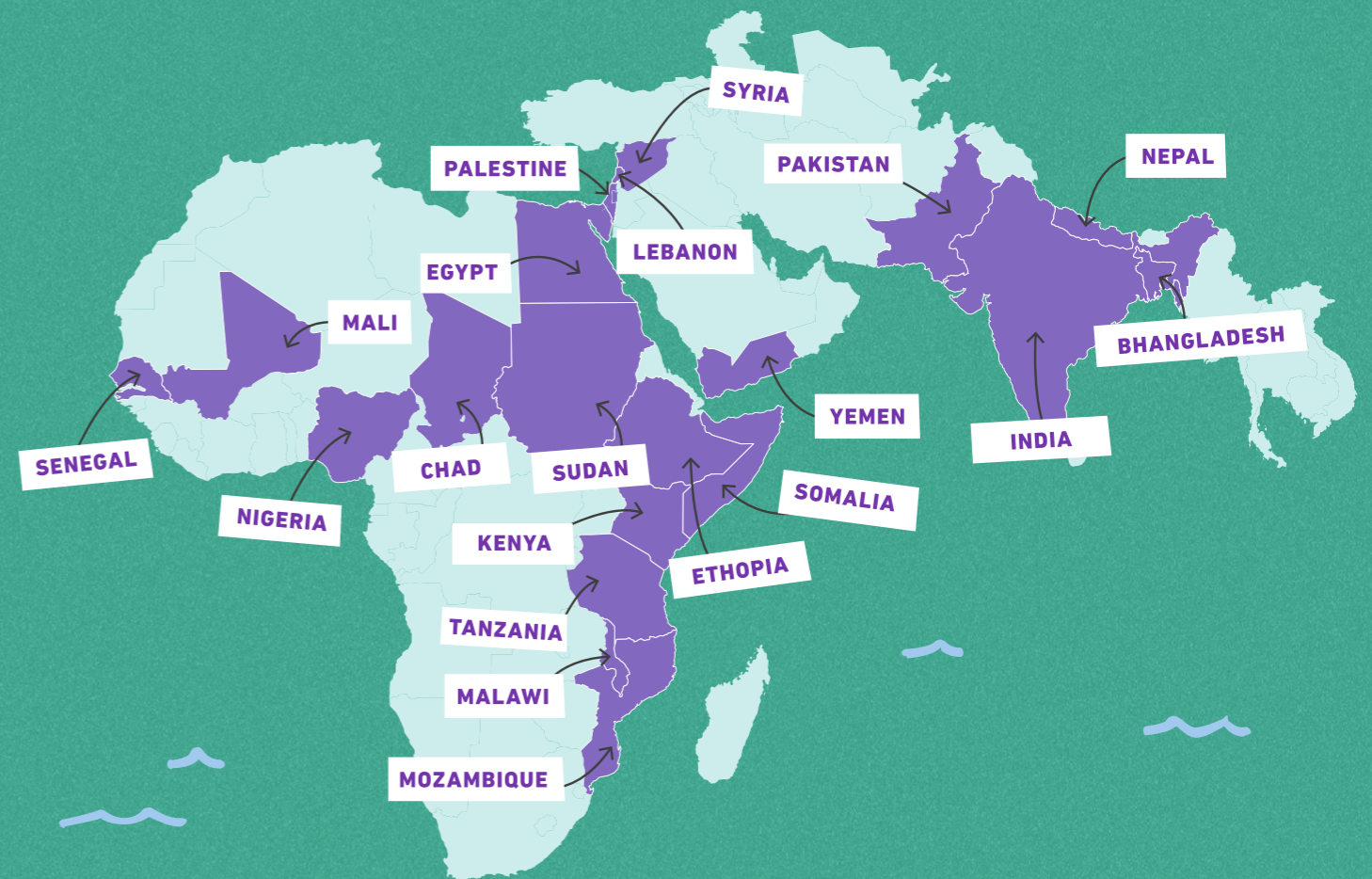

COMMUNITY SUPPORT INITIATIVES

During 2025, Human Appeal volunteers and partners supported local communities through several initiatives:

Food support

Food items and drinks were distributed through shelters, food banks, community centres, and masjid iftar programmes to support homeless individuals and families experiencing financial hardship.

Purple Parcels

Essential hygiene and household parcels were provided to domestic violence survivors, refugees, and low-income families, helping restore dignity and meet immediate needs.

Masjid Clean-ups

Volunteers supported local mosques by preparing prayer halls and facilities during Ramadan, helping ensure clean and welcoming spaces for worshippers.

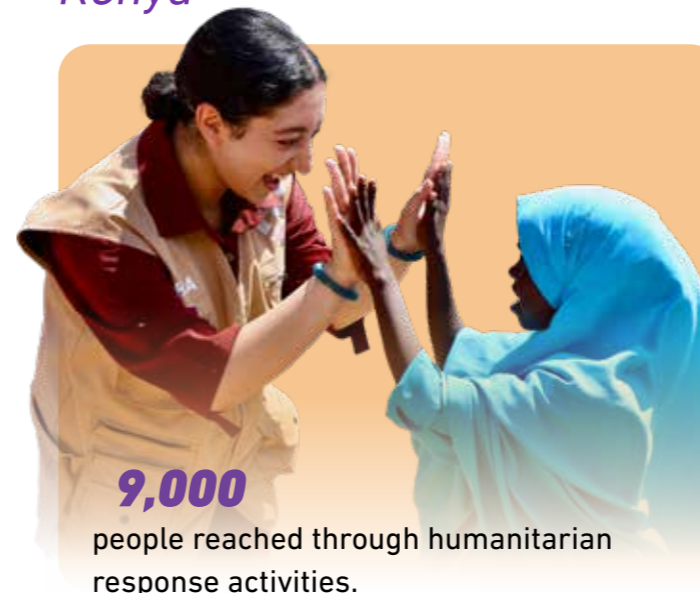

In 2025 alone, the Comedy Tour raised over £250,000 for emergency relief in Gaza.

WHAT PARTNERSHIPS ENABLE

Partnerships strengthen humanitarian response by combining the strengths of multiple organisations.

Speed

Partnerships enable rapid responses when disasters occur. International agencies provide access to crisis zones, while local partners bring established community trust.

Scale

Collaboration multiplies impact. During Pakistan’s 2022 floods, Human Appeal partnered with UNICEF to deliver WASH services to 635,320 people, a scale that would not have been possible alone.

Specialisation

Each partner contributes unique expertise:

- UN agencies – coordination, logistics, and large-scale programme delivery
- IOM – migration, displacement, and protection services
- Medical partners – pharmaceutical supplies and equipment
- Local partners – community access and cultural knowledge

Together, these partnerships ensure humanitarian assistance reaches those who need it most.

ACCOUNTABILITY & TRUST

When donors give to Human Appeal, they trust us to deliver their charity with integrity. That trust is sacred.

In 2025, Human Appeal supported 7,348,331 people through emergency relief, seasonal giving, and long-term programmes. Every

donation entrusted to us was carefully managed, every project monitored, and every person we served treated with dignity.

Humanitarian work is complex and often deeply challenging, but we remain committed to continuous improvement, learning from experience, and strengthening the systems that ensure aid reaches those who need it most.

Accountability is not simply a requirement. It is the foundation of trust.”

RESPONSIBLE STEWARDSHIP

Human Appeal operates under clear financial and programme governance processes to ensure donations are managed responsibly and used where they are needed most.

Financial Accountability

- Independent external audits conducted annually
- Transparent financial reporting published publicly
- Designated funds tracked separately, including Zakat and emergency appeals
- Cost-efficiency targets maintained across programmes

Programme Accountability

- Needs assessments conducted before each intervention
- Community participation in project design and delivery
- Feedback mechanisms allowing communities to share concerns or suggestions
- Post-distribution monitoring to confirm assistance reaches the intended communities

MONITORING IMPACT

Human Appeal monitors its programmes to ensure assistance is delivered effectively and creates meaningful change.

Information gathered through field visits, programme data, and community feedback helps teams measure progress and improve future interventions.

Human Appeal Tracks:

- **Outputs** – the number of people supported and services delivered
- **Outcomes** – changes in areas such as food security, health, education, and livelihoods
- **Long-term impact** – sustained improvements in well-being and resilience

Example: Cataract Surgery Programme

- In 2025, **2,686 people received cataract surgery** across Pakistan, Yemen, Somalia, and Bangladesh.

Within three months of surgery, 95% of patients regained functional sight, enabling many to return to work, resume education, and regain independence.

Safeguarding and Dignity

Human Appeal maintains zero tolerance for abuse, exploitation, or neglect. Safeguarding systems protect the safety and dignity of the communities we serve, as well as staff and volunteers.

Safeguarding measures include:

- Child safeguarding and protection policies across all programmes

- Protection from Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (PSEA) standards
- Code of Conduct signed by all staff and volunteers
- Confidential reporting channels for concerns
- Training and background checks for staff working with vulnerable communities

Every interaction with the communities we serve is guided by principles of respect, consent, confidentiality, and non-discrimination.

Zakat with Integrity

Zakat is a sacred trust. Human Appeal ensures that every Zakat donation is managed carefully and delivered through programmes that align with Islamic principles.

Oversight is provided by a Sharia Supervisory Board, and Zakat funds are managed through dedicated accounts to ensure they are used appropriately.

100% of Zakat donations are distributed, with no administrative costs deducted.
